

Year 2 - Newsletter

Welcome to the start of the new school term. We have lots of exciting activities and lessons planned for the children. Please find below information about the term ahead.

Learning planned for this term

English – We will be following Ready, Steady, Write and using the books **The Bog Baby** and **Grandad's Island**. We will be building writing skills to write a finding narrative, a set of instructions, a return narrative and an information text.

Phonics – We have phonics every day following Read Write Inc. We teach children all the sounds that they need to read and write by teaching a sound a day. Children are grouped by ability across KS1 for phonics.

Maths – We follow White Rose Maths. This term we will be teaching **Money, Multiplication & Division, Length & Height, and Mass, Capacity and Temperature**. We will be learning lots of different ways to solve problems and learn new skills. Please practice counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s and then learn them as times tables.

Science – In our **Living Things and their Habitats** topic we will be learning about things that living, dead or once alive and different types of habitats. We then distinguish which animals live in each habitat and how animals and plants depend on each other in order to survive. In our **Plants** topic we will be looking at the parts of plants and what things they need to grow and survive. We will be planting sunflowers and observing their growth over time.

History - We follow Cornerstones and this term our project is called **Magnificent Monarchs**. This project teaches children about the English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Using timelines, information about royal palaces, portraits and other historical sources, they build up an understanding of the monarchs and then research six of the most significant sovereigns. You will be able to access knowledge organiser which tells you all about what we are learning on google classroom.

Art and DT - We follow Cornerstones and this term our design and technology project is called **Cut, Stitch and Join**. The project teaches children about fabric home products and the significant British brand Cath Kidston. They learn about sewing patterns and using a running stitch before making a sewn bag tag. Our Art project for this term is called Portraits and Poses. This project teaches children about portraiture. They analyse the portraits of Tudor monarchs and compare Tudor portraits and selfies today. They use photo editing software to create royal portraits. You will be able to access knowledge organiser which tells you all about what we are learning on google classroom.

RE – In RE we follow Jigsaw and will be learning about Judaism and Christianity. Our enquiry questions will be **Who is God to Jews?** and **How important is it to Christians that Jesus came back to life after his crucifixion?**

PSHE – We follow Jigsaw and this term are topics are **Dreams and Goals** and **Healthy Me**.

Computing – We follow teach computing to teach our computing skills. Our topics are **Robot algorithms** and **Pictograms**. We will also cover e-safety.

PE – We follow Real PE. Our topics are **Dance, Gymnastics and Sporting Values**.

Music – We follow Charanga to teach music skills. Our topics are **I Wanna Play in a Band** and **Zootime**.

Timetable

We do Maths, English and Phonics every day in the mornings. In the afternoons we start with storybooks and then cover a range of different subjects including; Cornerstones (History/Geography/Art/D&T), PE, Handwriting, RE, Computing, Music, PSHE and Science.

Attendance

Please ensure that your child arrives at school.



The door will be open between 08:40 and 08:50. When your child is late they are missing out on valuable learning time.

Please also make sure that your child is collected on time each day.

Handwriting

We use Letterjoin which is a whole school handwriting scheme. We will be practising our handwriting through three taught handwriting sessions a week. Children need to learn cursive (joined up) handwriting.



On google classroom you will be able to see how we are teaching the children to form their letters in our handwriting lessons.

Houses

Each child is in a house. They will collect house points each week for all sorts of amazing things. House points are counted on a Friday and the winning house is announced in assembly.

Drop off in the morning

When dropping off your child in the morning please pass any messages onto the staff on the door they will then pass these onto the class teacher. Please do try to stay behind the yellow line and encourage your child to walk into school from there.

Collection in the afternoon

When collecting your child in the afternoon please do not go past the yellow line. Your child's class will stand on the school side of the line and the class teacher will dismiss the children from here.

Catch me cards

Each day the children work together to earn catch me cards for making good choices and following the golden values. These are counted at the end of the day and if they get 35, they exchange them for a golden coin.

Please ensure that your child brings in a bottle of water to school for the classroom each day.



Reading

Our reading books have been carefully chosen to engage children in reading as well as matching their reading ability. If books are lost or damaged there will be a small charge of £5 per book to cover the cost of replacing it. We hope that you love the books as much as we do.

Your child will get one reading book:

- RWI Book Bag Book – changed when your child's class teacher feels they are ready to. They could have a book for more than a week, this is to ensure that children have a good understanding of the sounds in each book.

Your child reads daily at school so please make sure they have their reading book every day. They will benefit more if heard regularly at home. New books and reading records will then be sent home on a Friday.

Please read with your child as often as possible and record it in their reading record. There are some top tips for reading at home at the back of Google Classrooms.
