

Year 2 - Newsletter

Welcome to the start of the new school year. We already have lots of exciting activities and lessons planned for the children. Please find below information about the term ahead.

Learning planned for this term

English – We will be following Ready, Steady, Write and using the books **A River** and **The Night Gardener**. We will be building writing skills to write narratives, letters, poems and character/setting descriptions.

Phonics – We have phonics every day following Read Write Inc. We teach children all the sounds that they need to read and write by teaching a sound a day. Children are grouped by ability across KS1 for phonics.

Maths – We follow White Rose Maths. This term we will be teaching **place value, addition & subtraction and shape**. We will be learning lots of different ways to solve problems and learn new skills. Please practice counting and writing your numbers to 100. If your child is ready, you could challenge them to add and subtract numbers within 100.

Science – In our **Everyday Materials** topic, we will be learning about the properties of different materials and discussing why certain things are made out of certain materials. We will be completing an experiment to see which materials will be best at protecting Humpty Dumpty if he fell off the wall.

History – We follow Cornerstones and this term our project is called **Movers and shakers**. This project teaches children about historically significant people who have had a major impact on the world. They will learn to use timelines, stories and historical sources to find out about the people featured and use historical models to explore their significance.

Geography – We follow Cornerstones and this term our project is called **Let's explore the world**. This project teaches children about atlases, maps and cardinal compass points. They learn about the characteristics of the four countries of the United Kingdom.

DT – We follow Cornerstones and this term our design and technology project is called **Remarkable recipes**. This project teaches children about sources of food and tools used for food preparation.

RE – This term we are excited to be starting Jigsaw RE. Our focus this term will be **Christianity**.

PSHE – We follow Jigsaw and this term our topics are **Being me in the world** and **Celebrating difference**.

Computing – We follow teach computing to teach our computing skills. Our topics are **IT around us** and **Digital Photography**.

PE – We follow Real PE. Our topics this term are **fundamental movement skills** and **exploring footwork, patterns, balance and stance**.

Music – We follow Charanga to teach music skills. Our unit is called **Hands, feet and heart**.

Timetable

We do Maths, English and Phonics every day in the mornings. In the afternoons we start with storybooks and then cover a range of different subjects including; Cornerstones (History/Geography/Art/D&T), PE, Handwriting, RE, Computing, Music, PSHE and Science.

Attendance

Please ensure that your child arrives at school.



The door will be open between 08:40 and 08:50. When your child is late they are missing out on valuable learning time.

Please also make sure that your child is collected on time each day.

Houses

Each child is in a house. They will collect house points each week for all sorts of amazing things. House points are counted on a Friday and the winning house is announced in assembly.

Uniform

Catch me cards

Each day the children work together to earn catch me cards for making good choices and following the golden values. These are counted at the end of the day and if they have got 35 they exchange them for a golden coin.

Drinks

Please ensure that your child brings in a bottle of water to school for the classroom each day. No squash/juice please.



Food

Please can you ensure you place any food orders by 4pm the night before (4pm Friday for a Monday dinner), otherwise your child will be offered a jacket potato. Children are not able to have part of a school dinner and need to bring either packed lunch or order a school meal. A reminder the packed lunch must be nut free.



Handwriting

We use Letter join which is a whole school handwriting scheme. We will be practising our handwriting through three taught handwriting sessions a week. Children need to learn cursive (joined up) handwriting.



On the year 2 class page on the school website you will be able to see how we are teaching the children to form their letters in our handwriting lessons.

Drop off in the morning

When dropping off your child in the morning please pass any messages onto the staff on the door they will then pass these onto the class teacher. Please do try to stay behind the yellow line and encourage your child to walk into school from there.

Collection in the afternoon

When collecting your child in the afternoon please do not go past the yellow line. Your child's class will stand on the school side of the line and the class teacher will dismiss the children from here. Collection time is 3:10 for year 1 pupils.

PE

Year 2 PE will be every **TUESDAY & FRIDAY.**

Children **MUST** come to school on these days in their PE kit. Our school PE kit consists of:



- Oak Green (logo) or plain, white or black t-shirt
- Black shorts, leggings, jogging bottoms or tracksuit bottoms
- Black Oak Green logo 'hoodie' (NO other hoodies or logo-ed clothing).
- Green Oak Green fleece or sweatshirt or cardigan can also be worn as outside wear in colder weather.
- Stud earrings must be removed or covered.
- Children **MUST** have appropriate trainers / plimsolls.

Reading

Our reading books have been carefully chosen to engage children in reading as well as matching their reading ability. If books are lost or damaged there will be a small charge of £5 per book to cover the cost of replacing it. We hope that you love the books as much as we do.

Your child will get one reading book:

- RWI Book Bag Book – changed when your child's class teacher feels they are ready to. They could have a book for more than a week, this is to ensure that children have a good understanding of the sounds in each book.

Your child reads daily at school so please make sure they have their reading book every day. They will benefit more if heard regularly at home. New books and reading records will then be sent home on a Friday.

Please read with your child as often as possible and record it in their reading record. There are some top tips for reading at home at the back of Google Classrooms.
