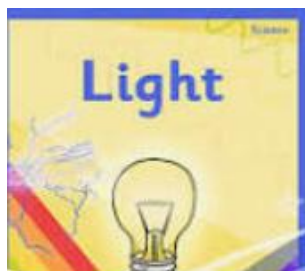


Oak Green School Curriculum Newsletter

Year 6

Spring 2 2026

In English lessons this half term, Year 6 have been inspired to write hunted narratives and balanced arguments based on the book 'The Ways of the Wolf' by Smriti Halls. While composing their narrative writing, the children have considered their use of formal language, informal speech structures as well as using effective imagery to describe settings. When writing balanced arguments, they have explored using debate vocabulary to express opinions and how punctuation, such as colons and dashes, can enhance the clarity of what they write.



In science lessons this half term, Year 6 have been exploring how light travels in a straight line and how it interacts with different materials. They investigated how shadows are formed, examining their size, shape, and how these are affected by the position of the light source and the object. The children also explored how many shadows can be cast by a single object.

In art this half term, children have been looking at the artwork of Inuit communities. They have created sculptures of Arctic animals using soap and designed stencils to create beautiful prints based off the artwork of Kenojuak Ashevak. This has helped to further develop their understanding of life in the Arctic for indigenous people whilst also exploring how print is used to recreate powerful images.
