Learning planned for this term

English- This term, our writing lessons will focus on biography writing, discovery narratives and writing explanations. To continue to develop our passion and pleasure for reading, we will be studying the book 'Goodnight Mister Tom' by Michelle Magorian

Science – This term, we will be studying Electricity.

History – We will be learning about World War One and World War Two and the impact of these events on the world today.

Art- This term the children will study 'Bees, Beetles and Butterflies' looking at how nature inspires art through observational drawing and mixed media.

DT- Our topic will be 'Make, Do and Mend' exploring textiles, analysing how clothes are made as well as deigning and recreating our own.

SATs

Just a reminder that the children in Year 6 will be sitting their SAT tests the week beginning 11th May. A **FREE** breakfast club will be available for all Year 6 pupils from 8:20am in the dining room (please arrive via the staff carpark – the usual end of the day exit) Children may just come along to sit with friends if they would prefer to have their breakfast at home. It is essential that all children are in school to sit their tests. PE

PE is still on a Tuesday and a Friday for all Year 6 classes. Please ensure that your child comes into school wearing their PE kit.

Swimming:

If your child is due to be swimming, please ensure they have the correct swimming kit. Children should still come to school in their PE kit.
